The meeting was called to order by Mayor Tedford at 9:00 a.m.

Mayor Tedford led the Pledge of Allegiance.

City Clerk Cordes explained that, for the period July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017, \$17,590,897.00 was charged to utility customers for the services of electric, water, sewer, sanitation, and water treatment. Out of the \$17,590,897 billed, the City Clerk's Office has been unable to collect \$67,012.46, less than 3/10 of 1%. These accounts are a year old and are no longer City of Fallon utility customers. The balance due to the City has been turned over to a collection agency.

Mayor Tedford added that this will not prevent collection of the funds owed. If the people on this list move back into the City, they must pay the past due bill before they receive City services.

Legal and Administrative Director Erquiaga provided an update on the project status. A&K Earth Movers will be mobilizing next week – so some ground will be moving soon. Building design is still ongoing and complicated but they are working through that process. The purpose of this resolution is to properly account for the City's contributions to the youth center City Clerk Cordes has spent a significant amount of time analyzing the City's contribution, which has already been made, and created this resolution to ensure that the expenditures are properly accounted to the Quality of Life account in the Electrical Enterprise Fund. The ultimate goal is for the facility to house the Fallon Youth Club and to serve the youth of our community. It is certainly the belief that this project will enhance the City's quality of life and serve the best interests of the City. This resolution is to clarify the accounting of funds for the Quality of Life account; which is further determination that this is in line with Resolution No. 16-30 wherein the Council further defined the purpose of the Electric Enterprise Fund. This will also set forth a timeline of those expenditures; we are hopeful that the contributions will be: \$200,000 in fiscal year 2018, \$225,000 in fiscal year 2019, and \$200,000 in fiscal year 2020. If so, they will actually track the progress of the project. But it is also noted that those timelines are estimates and subject to change. This resolution will allow some flexibility for the Mayor and the City Clerk to adjust the timing of those contributions and the accounting of those contributions to the Quality of Life Fund as necessary, as the project proceeds.
