DISCUSSION: NRS 354.598005 authorizes the City to augment a budget when anticipated resources actually available during a budget period exceed those estimated. The City must comply with NRS 354.598005 and NAC 354.400 through 354.490, inclusive, in order to properly augment a budget. Pursuant to NRS 354.598005(l)(a), in order to augment the appropriations of a fund to which ad valorem taxes are allocated as a source of revenue, the City Council must adopt a resolution reciting the appropriations to be augmented and the nature of the unanticipated resources intended to be used for the augmentation. The Council must publish notice of its intention to act on the resolution and must not take action until at least three (3) days after publication of the notice.

The General Fund and the Airport Fund are both funds to which ad valorem taxes are allocated as a source of revenue. The attached proposed Resolution satisfies the requirements of both the Nevada Revised Statutes and the Nevada Administrative Code. Notice of the Council's intention to act on the proposed Resolution was published in the Lahontan Valley News on June 23, 2021 and the Proof and Statement of Publication is attached hereto. If approved, the proposed

Resolution will augment the budget of the General Fund and the Airport Fund in order to properly account for the resources and expenditures of those funds.

Hundred Forty-Seven Thousand One Hundred Thirty Dollars (\$4,447,130.00) for use in the General Fund, thereby increasing its appropriations from \$10,210,617 to \$14,657,747, and by appropriating Seven Hundred Thirty-Nine Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty-Nine Dollars (\$739,789.00) for use in the Airport Fund, thereby increasing its appropriations from \$122,551 to \$862,340. Detailed schedules are attached to this Resolution and by reference are made a part thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk/Treasurer shall immediately forward all necessary documentation relating to this Resolution to the Nevada Department of Taxation.

RECOMMENDED COUNCIL ACTION: Motion to approve and adopt Resolution No. 21-04: A resolution authorizing a temporary interfund loan from the Water Treatment Enterprise Fund to the Sanitation Enterprise Fund in the amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00), and other matters properly related thereto.

DISCUSSION: The Council authorized a temporary interfund loan from the Water Treatment Enterprise Fund to the Sanitation Enterprise Fund in the amount of Three Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$365,000.00) on June 30,2020. The loan was, by its terms, to be repaid in full on or before June 30, 2021. The interfund loan was paid down One Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$165,000.00) in fiscal year 2020-2021 leaving a balance of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) as of June 30, 2021. A rate increase in the Sanitation Enterprise Fund was effective November 2020 with the intentions, the additional revenue would be sufficient to pay off the interfund loan in full by fiscal year. However, the fund needed the additional revenue in all twelve months of the fiscal year to have the ability to payoff the loan in full. The rates are adjusted annually according to the Consumer Price Index. With another rate increase in the next fiscal year, the City anticipates this loan to be fully paid off by June 30. 2022.

In order to properly authorize a temporary interfund loan, the Council must comply with NRS 354.6118 and NAC 354.290. The proposed Resolution, and the findings and determinations contained therein, satisfy those requirements. If approved, the proposed temporary interfund loan will be repaid in full within one (1) year after the date on which the loan is made and will bear no interest.

FISCAL IMPACT: Extension of a portion of a prior loan in the amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00)

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A TEMPORARY INTERFUND LOAN FROM THE WATER TREATMENT ENTERPRISE FUND TO THE SANITATION ENTERPRISE FUND IN THE AMOUNT OF TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$200,000), AND OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATED THERETO.

WHEREAS, the City Council authorized a temporary interfund loan from the Water Treatment Enterprise Fund to the Sanitation Enterprise Fund in the amount of Three Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$365,000.00) on June 30,2020; and

WHEREAS, the June 30, 2020 temporary interfund loan was, by its terms, to be repaid in full on or before June 30, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the City fully intended to repay the June 30,2020 temporary interfund loan during fiscal year 2020-2021 but only paid the loan down One Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$165,000); and

WHEREAS, the Sanitation Enterprise Fund increased its utility rates during fiscal year 2020- 2021 effective November 2020; and

WHEREAS, the fund did not receive a full fiscal year of additional revenue from the rate adjustment, as a result, the Sanitation Enterprise Fund is unable to repay the June 30, 2020 temporary interfund loan in full and is in need of further financial assistance from the Water Treatment Enterprise Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Sanitation Enterprise Fund is seeking a temporary interfund loan in the total amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) from the Water Treatment Enterprise Fund ("the Loan").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FOUND AND DETERMINED by the City Council of the City of Fallon that:

- 1. A properly noticed public hearing was held on June 30, 2021 in order to consider the Loan:
- 2. A sufficient amount of money is available in the Water Treatment Enterprise Fund for the Loan and the money is not restricted as to its use:
- 3. The Loan will not compromise the economic viability of the Water Treatment Enterprise Fund;
- 4. The money for the Loan will not be obtained from the proceeds from the sale of a bond; and
- 5. The Loan is not made from a debt service fund or from a fund established or maintained as a fund dedicated to the payment of bonded debt and interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Fallon that, based upon the findings and determinations set forth herein, a loan from the Water Treatment Enterprise Fund to the Sanitation Enterprise Fund in the total amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) is hereby authorized on the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The Loan will be repaid in full within one (1) year after the date on which the Loan is made:
- 2. The Loan will be repaid by the Sanitation Enterprise Fund in payments of such amount and at such times as deemed appropriate, so long as the entire Loan is repaid in full within one (1) year as set forth above; and
- 3. No interest will he charged for the Loan.

RECOMMENDED COUNCIL ACTION: Motion to approve and adopt Resolution No. 21-05: A resolution authorizing a temporary interfund loan from the Electric Enterprise Fund to the Water Enterprise Fund in the amount of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00), and other matters properly related thereto.

DISCUSSION: The City currently has two major street and utility infrastructure improvement projects still in progress as of June 30, 2021. The two projects are the South Maine Streetscape and Front Street Reconstruction. The project costs are allocated to multiple funds with differing amounts depending on the type of work. The Water Enterprise is one of the funds with costs allocated to it. The costs in the Water Enterprise Fund are to be paid with Regional Transportation Commission funding, Federal Grants and Cash. The Regional Transportation Commissions funds will be drawn in July 2021 and the Federal Grants will not be received until fiscal year 2021-2022. The Water Enterprise Fund does not have the cash flow to absorb the projects expenses without the funding sources mentioned previously. If approved, the proposed temporary interfund loan will allow the Water Enterprise Fund to meet its financial obligations until the project funding is received.

In order to properly authorize a temporary interfund loan, the Council must comply with NRS 354.6118 and NAC 354.290. The proposed Resolution, and the findings and determinations contained therein, satisfy those requirements. If approved, the proposed temporary interfund loan will be repaid in full within one (1) year after the date on which the loan is made and will bear no interest.

FISCAL IMPACT: Decreased cash flow in Electric Enterprise Fund and increased cash flow in the Water Enterprise Fund for Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00)

WHEREAS, the Water Enterprise Fund's allocated costs for these projects are to paid with Regional Transportation Commission funds, Federal Grants and Cash; and

WHEREAS, the Regional Transportation Commission funds will not be drawn until July 2021 and Federal Grants will not be received until fiscal year 2021-2022; and

WHEREAS, the Water Enterprise Fund does not have sufficient cash on hand without the funding sources mentioned above; and

WHEREAS, the Water Enterprise Fund is seeking a temporary interfund loan in the total amount of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) from the Electric Enterprise Fund ("the Loan").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FOUND AND DETERMINED by the City Council of the City of Fallon that:

- 1. A properly noticed public hearing was held on June 30, 2021 in order to consider the Loan;
- 2. A sufficient amount of money is available in the Electric Enterprise Fund for the Loan and the money is not restricted as to its use;
- 3. The Loan will not compromise the economic viability of the Electric Enterprise Fund:
- 4. The money for the Loan will not be obtained from the proceeds from the sale of a bond; and
- 5. The Loan is not made from a debt service fund or from a fund established or maintained as a fund dedicated to the payment of bonded debt and interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Fallon that, based upon the findings and determinations set forth herein, a loan from the Electric Enterprise Fund to the Water Enterprise Fund in the total amount of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) is hereby authorized on the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The Loan will be repaid in full within one (1) year after the date on which the Loan is made;
- 2. The Loan will be repaid by the Water Enterprise Fund in payments of such amount and at such times as deemed appropriate, so long as the entire Loan is repaid in full within one (1) year as set forth above; and
- 3. No interest will he charged for the Loan.
