

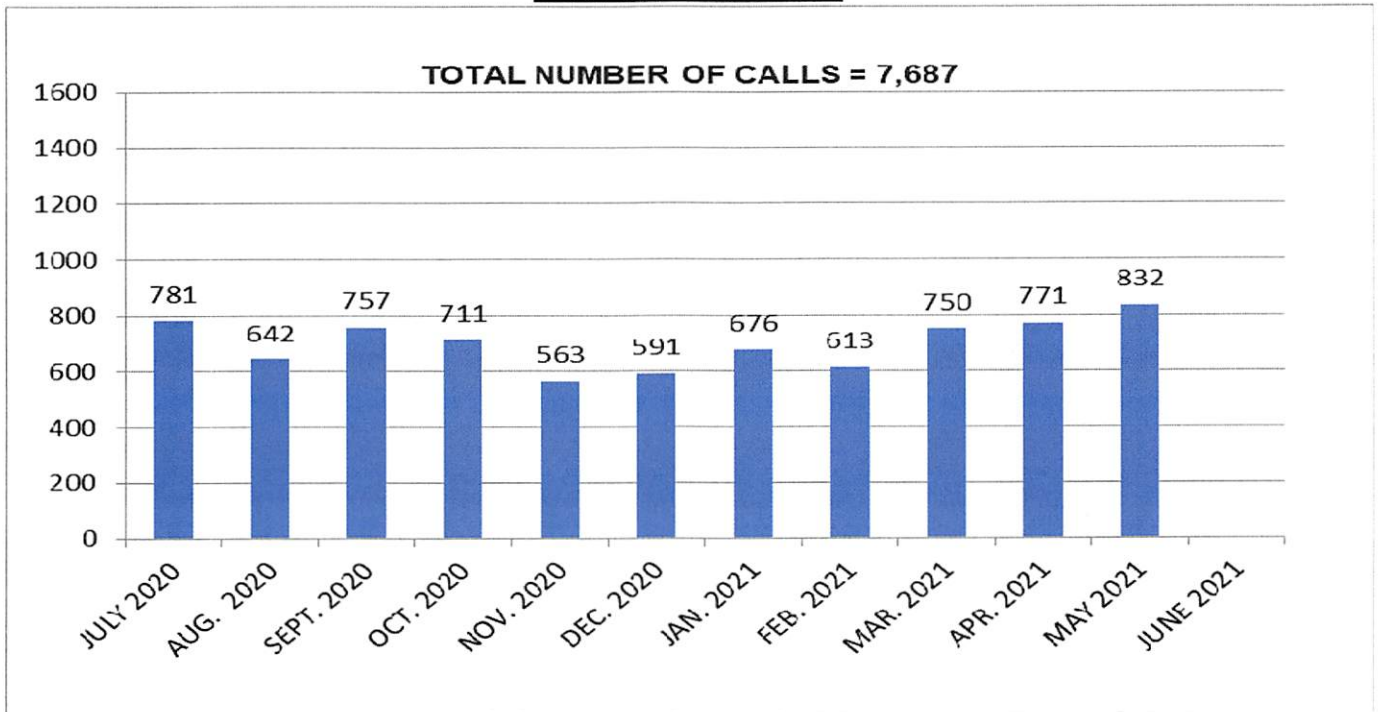

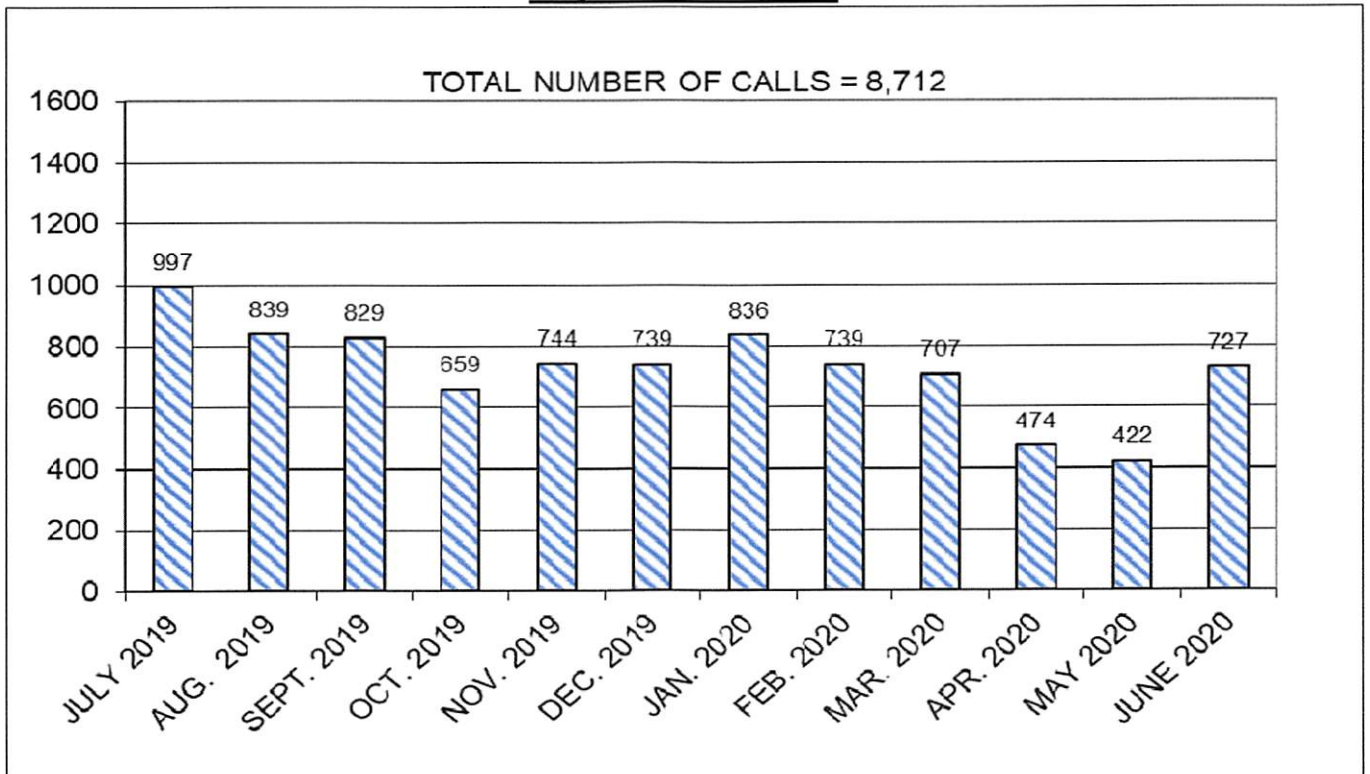

July 2020-June 2021

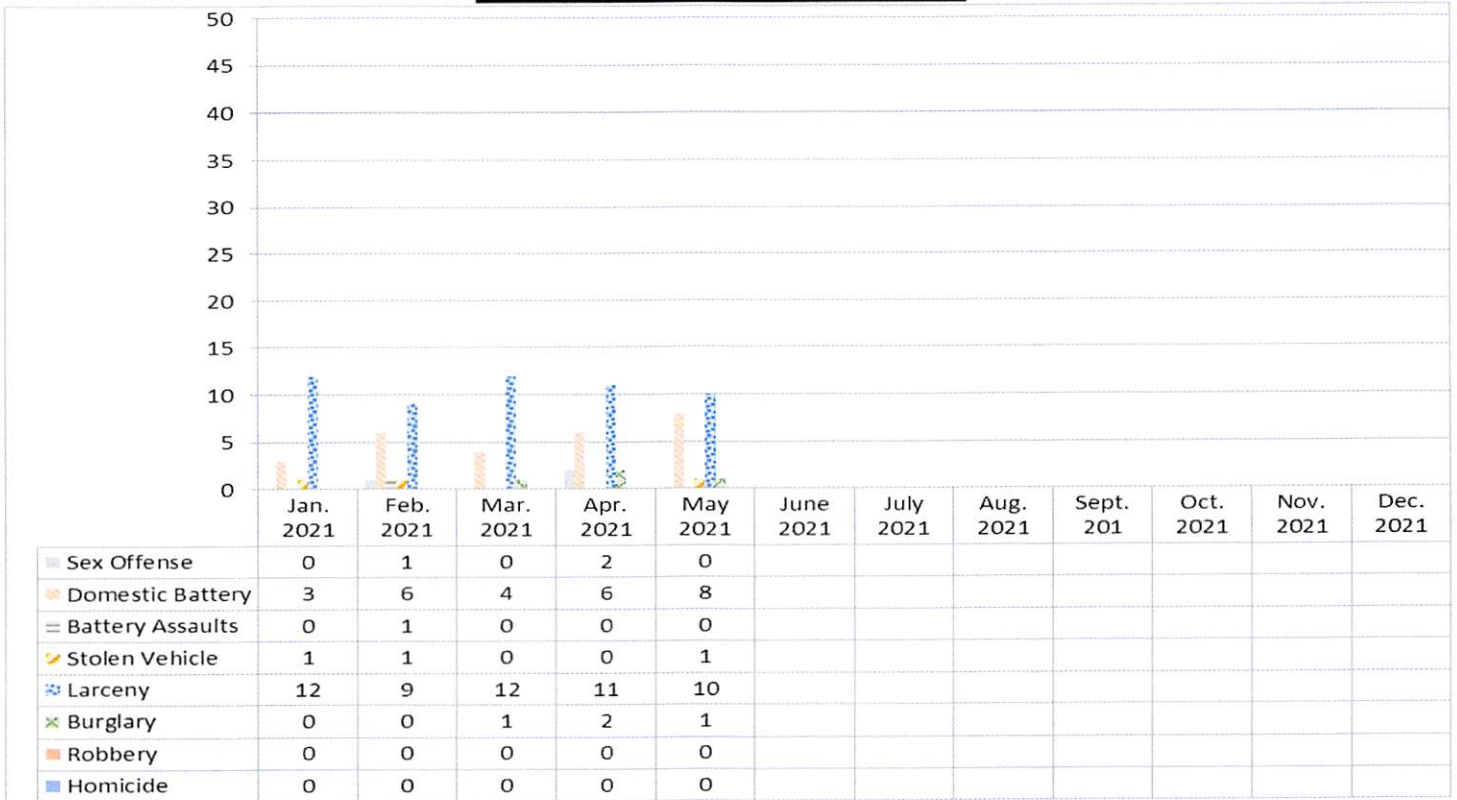

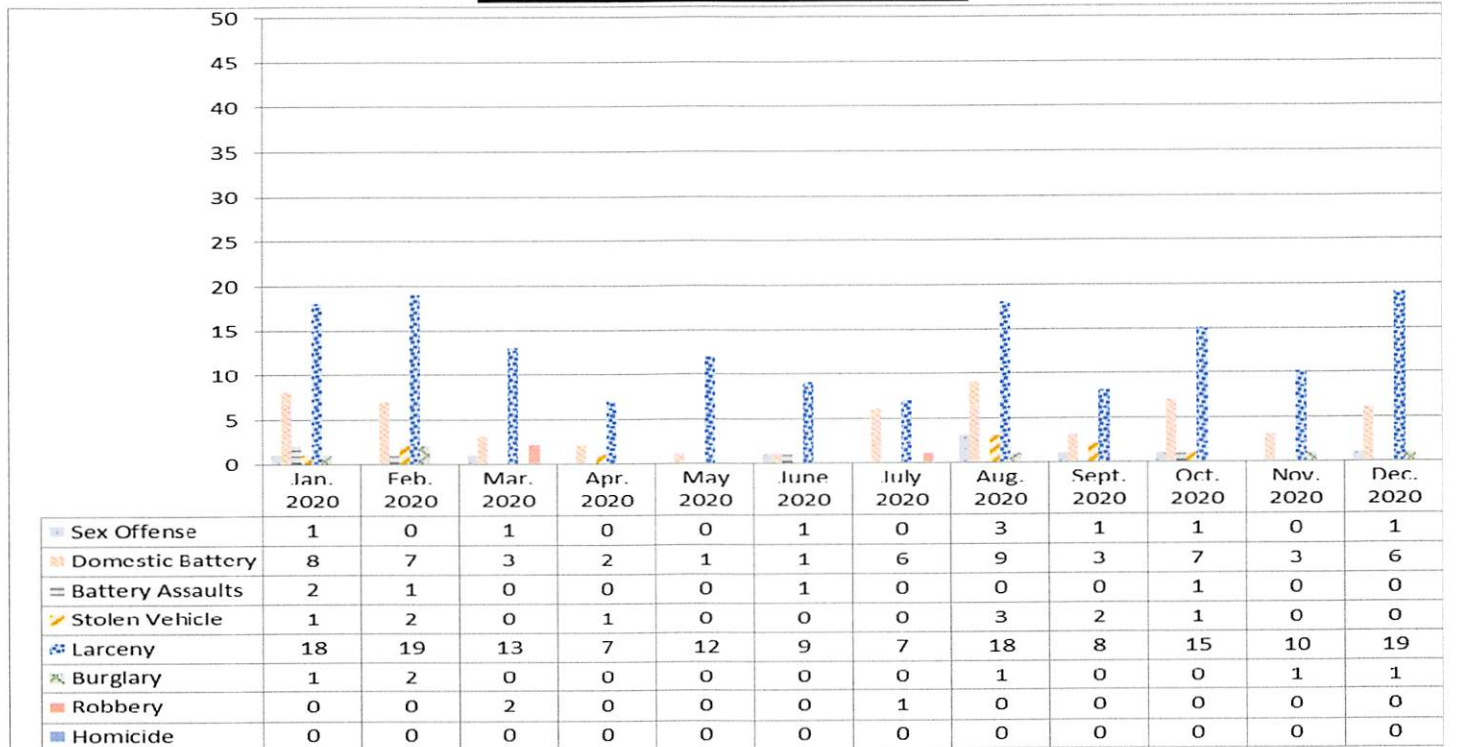

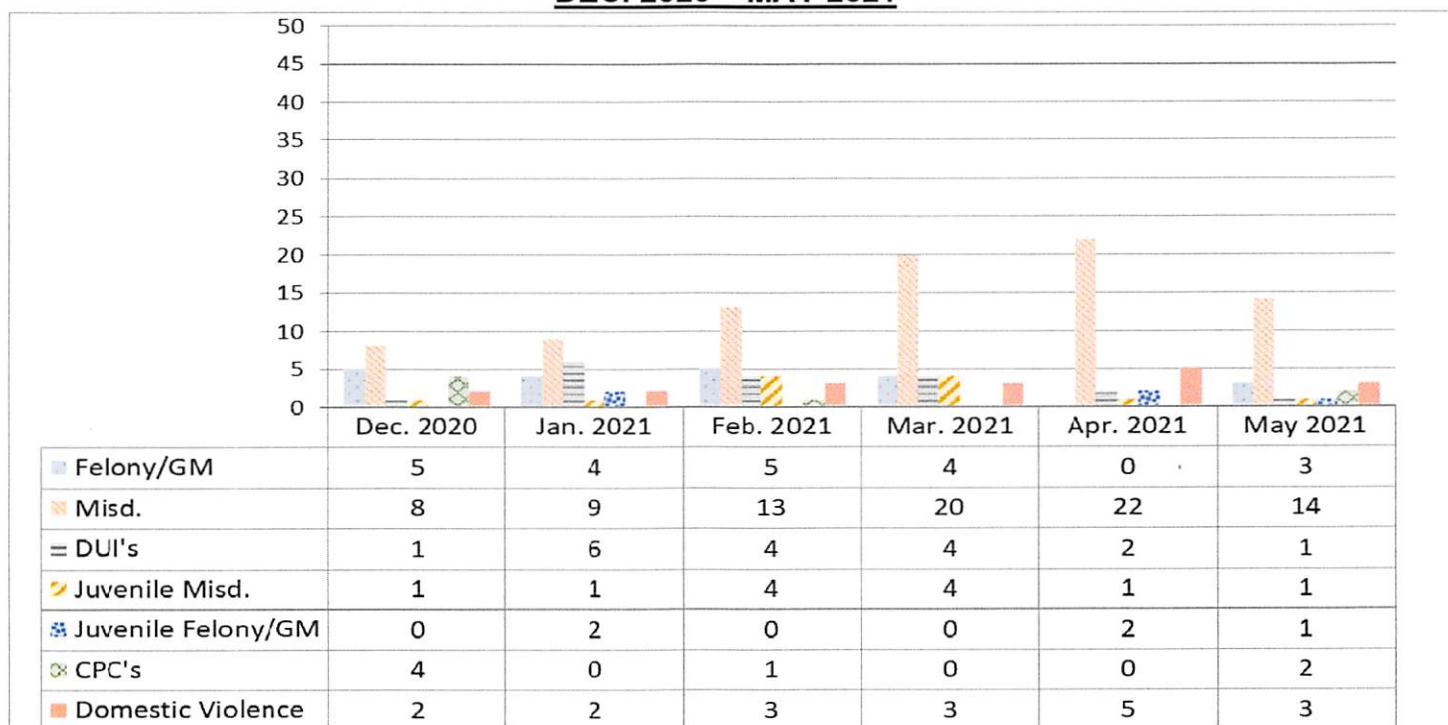
JANUARY – DECEMBER 2021



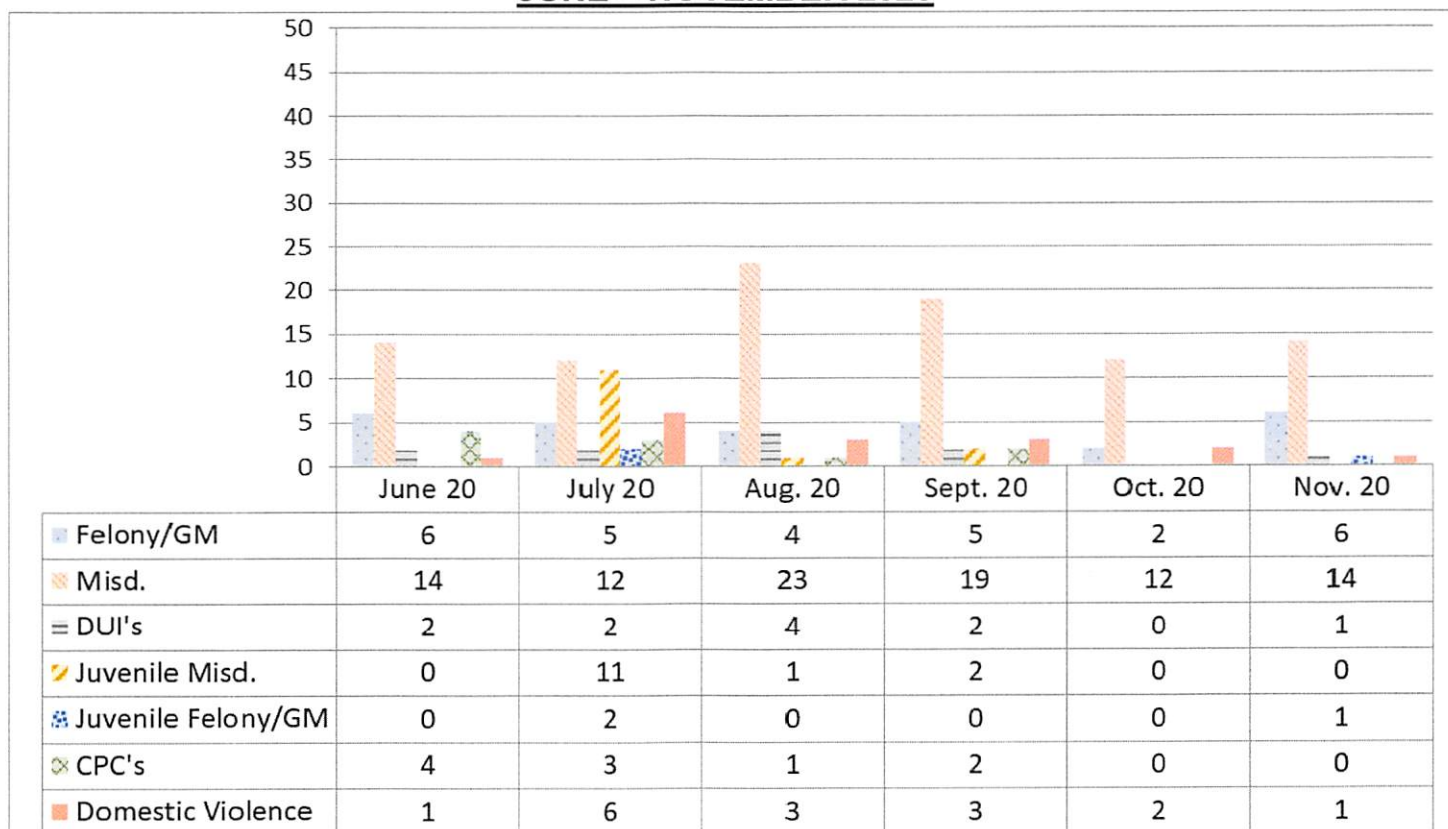
JANUARY – DECEMBER 2020



ARREST SUMMARY DEC. 2020 – MAY 2021



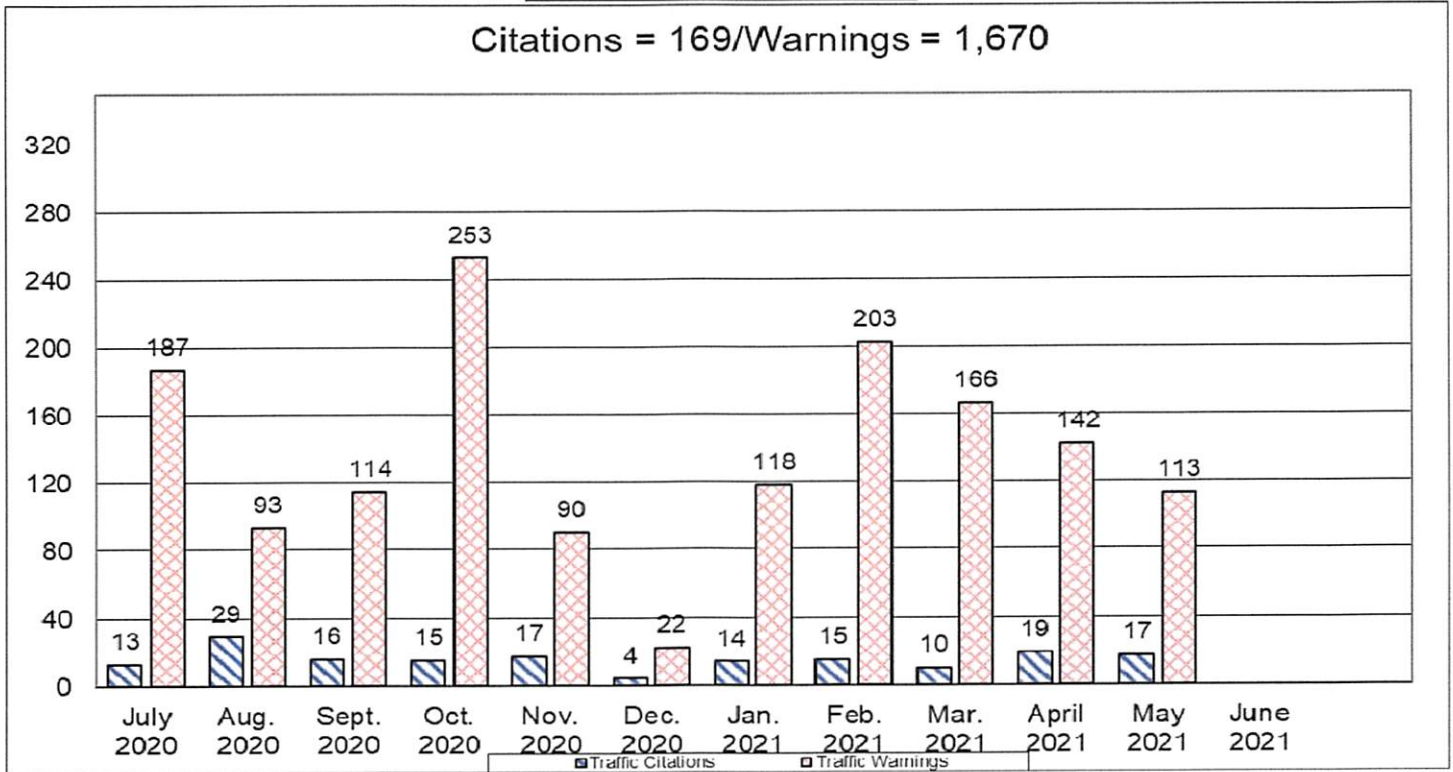

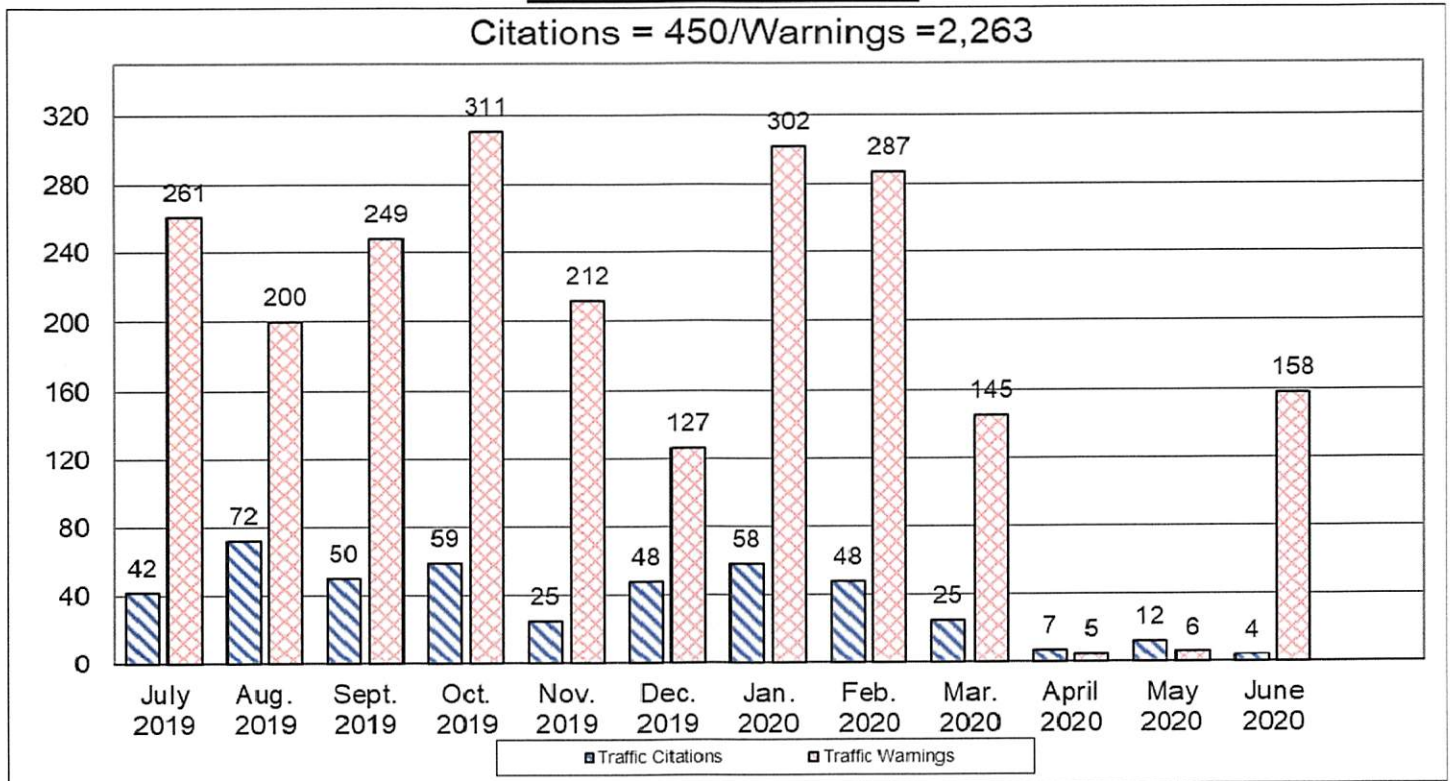
JULY 2020 – JUNE 2021

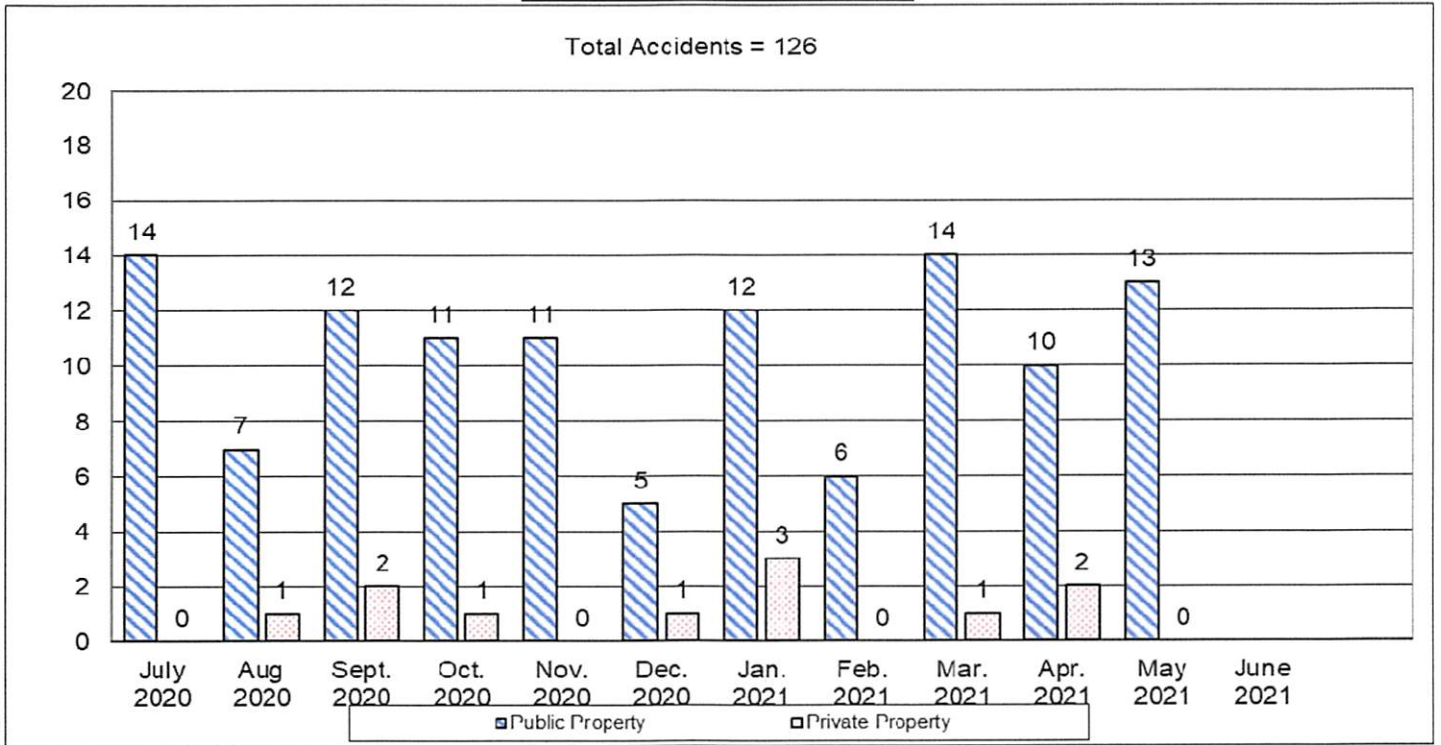
JULY 2019 – JUNE 2020

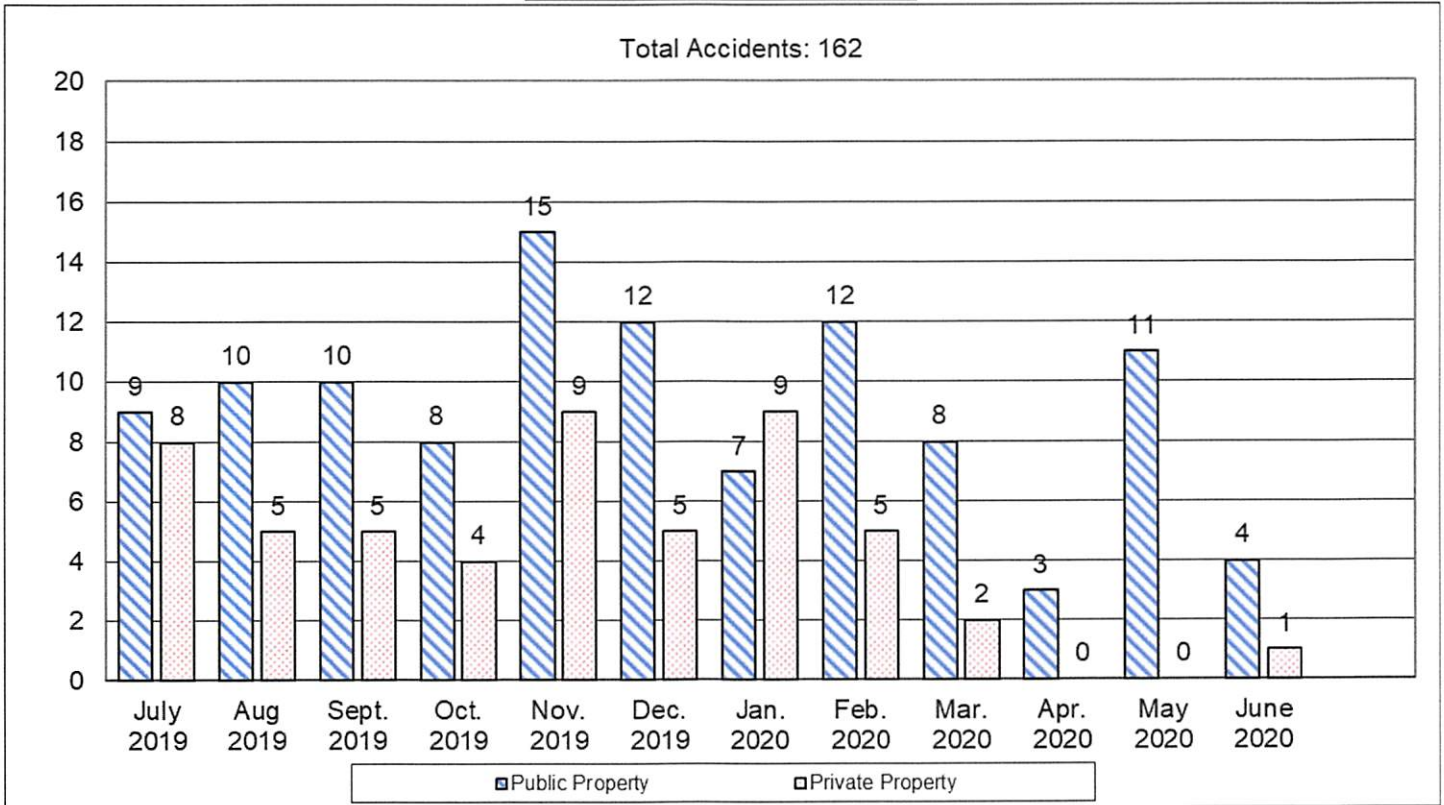


TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS

JULY 2020 – JUNE 2021



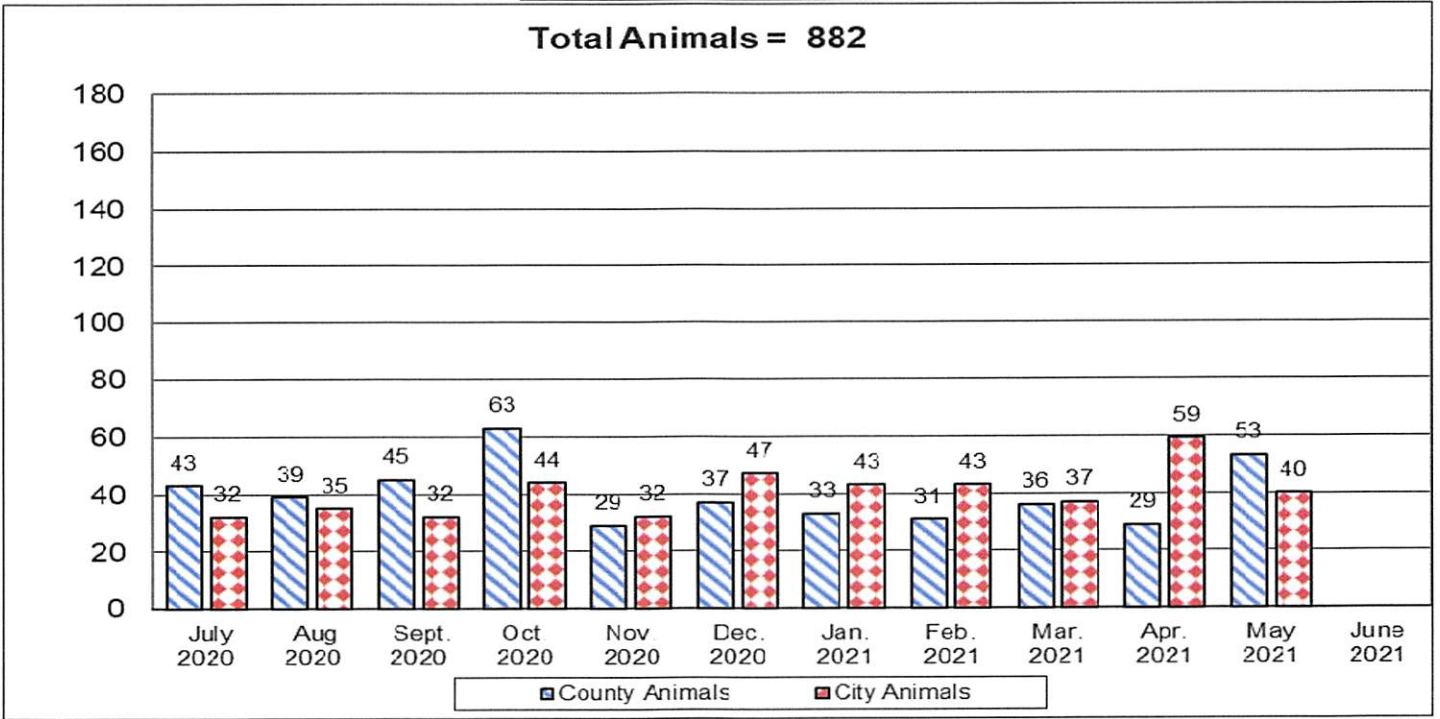

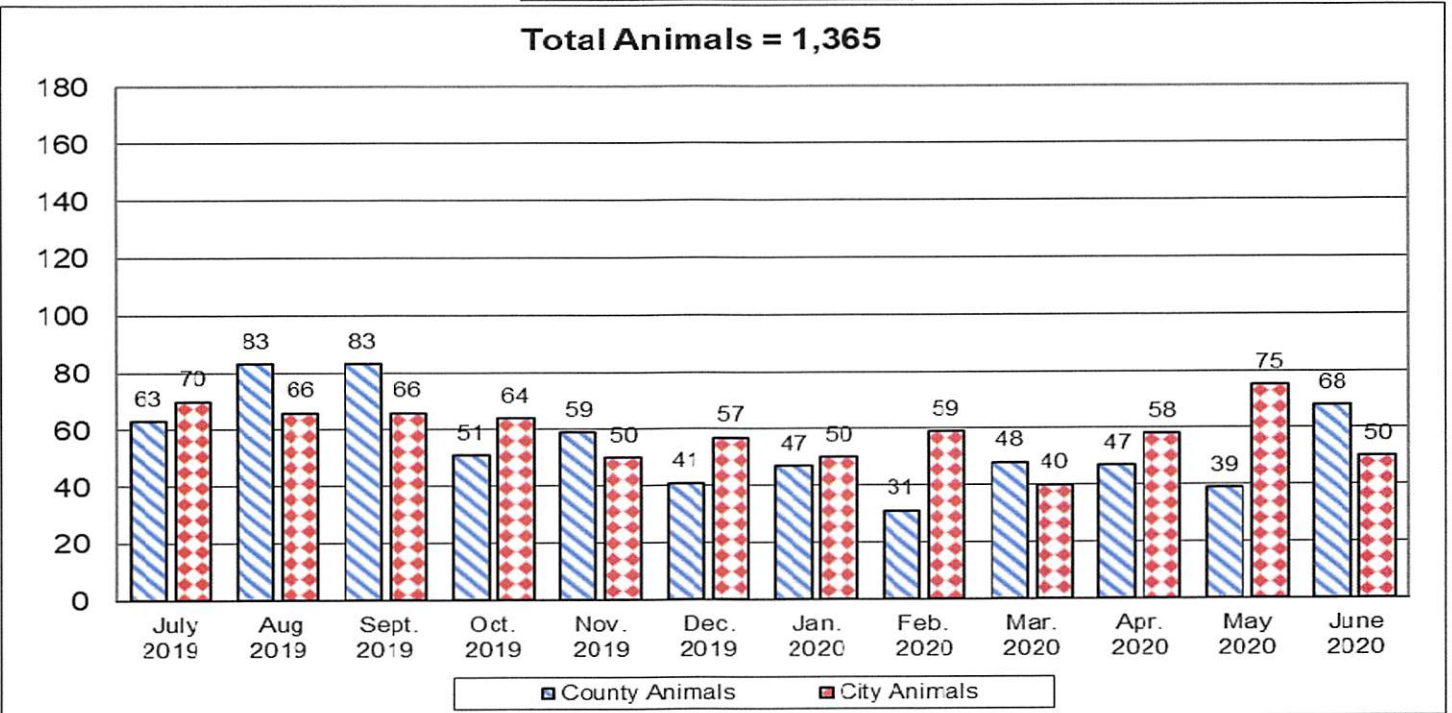
JULY 2020 – JUNE 2021

ASSISTANCE

INDOCTRINATION @ NAS FALLON

CHURCHILL COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT

May 20, 2021, School Resource Officer assisted Social Worker, Sean Lacow, who needed his assistance in a challenge at Lahontan Elementary.
