

Calls for Service/Total Incidents Reported










ASSISTANCE

During the month of August, we provided a bus ticket to one person.

INDOCTRINATION

During the month of August there was one indoctrination as NAS Fallon.

VOLUNTEERS IN POLICE SERVICES

August 2022 the Fallon Police VIPS volunteered one hundred eighty-one hours (181) hours to the agency.

These hours of consisted of Domestic Violence meetings, Vin Inspections, Helping Hands contacts and school visits.

OTHER PUBLIC RELATIONS

During August officers conducted special detail for the following:

- On August 9th, 2022, officers provided “Stop the Bleed” training to school nurses.
- On August 20th, 2022, officers provided a funeral escort from St. Patrick’s Church to the Gardens.
- On August 26th, 2022, officers attended the High School football game.

BREAKDOWN OF ARRESTS

During the month of August, the Police Department had thirty-five (35) total arrests:

- Of the eight (8) felony arrests, two (2) of them were warrant arrests and three were P&P violations.
- There was one Gross Misdemeanor arrest.
- Of the eleven (11) misdemeanor arrests, ten (10) were misdemeanor warrant arrests.

- Of the nine (9) juvenile arrests, 7 were for fighting.

BREAKDOWN OF THEFT REPORTS

During the month of July, the Police Department took twelve (12) Theft reports:
